#### Triumph Noggins are held at the Fairmount Bowls Club, Sandringham.

**Johannesburg Club** noggins are held at the Fairmount Bowls Club in Sandringham on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of every month and Club runs take place every 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month. Supper will be served at a cost of R30.00 per head and a cash bar is available.

#### **Directions to Fairmount Bowls Club**

From the N3 Highway take exit 119B - Johannesburg/Modderfontein off-ramp and go towards Johannesburg along the R25W. Go past the Edenvale Hospital and straight over Swemmer/Club Roads (there's Sandringham high-school on the corner) and straight on with George Road in Sandringham.

Travel approx. 2km along George to the club. Along the way, go past a Spar shopping centre on your left, through several traffic lights. Go past a Shell filling station on your right, then the Sandringham Vet Clinic on your right.

The Fairmount Bowls Club will be on your right, about 40 meters before an Engen Filling station. The sign posting at the entrance is not very big. If you miss it, simply turn into the Garage and retrace your tacks and you will find it.

#### **OBITUARY - KOOS CONRADIE**

Koos was one of those rare individuals you liked at once as he had the ability to make one feel he was interested in you.

I first met Koos when he requested me to restore his TR4A and got to know him during the next couple of years. He was a true classic car enthusiast and could not wait for his TR4A to be finished so he bought a 911 SC TARGA as the restoration was taking longer than expected, however I did get to know a bit about him during frequent visits to the workshop.

Koos was from good Afrikaner stock as his father was head of the Dutch Reform Church and Broederbond, but was somewhat of a rebel, perhaps as a result of being educated at Stellenbosch University where he studied Geology as a member of the SA Defence Force. His memories of the Western Cape usually revolved around his Cortina GT, his rugby prowess and how much wine he and his friends consumed.

After the Army Koos joined Anglo American as a field Geologist during which time he married Trish Steytler and had two daughters Elaine and Kate. On leaving Anglo he set up his own company doing computer modelling for local and international companies.

Once the TR4A was finished Koos was like a little boy with a new toy and frequently visited with his grandson Chris as a passenger who loved the outings. Koos also persuaded me to go on numerous runs with him including two MG Regularity Rallies as I was his "mechanic".

The two events with Koos will stay with me for ever are; the trip we did together in his 911 to the George Motor Show in 2011 and the National Gathering in Plet 2012 when he was in the TR4A and myself in the TR7V8. On both occasions we stayed at his beautiful holiday home in Knysna. It was during these stays in Knysna that I got to realise what a generous man he was and how much he adored his wife, children and grandchildren as he never stopped talking about them in glowing terms.

It was with a heavy heart that I learned that Koos passed away on 19 June following the car accident on route to Knysna in which Trish was fatally injured. My heart goes out to Elaine, Kate and grandchildren.

REST IN PEACE my friend and hope you have fun driving the highways in heaven. John Dobbins

#### **TSWAING METEORITE CRATER**

Approximately 40 Km. north west of Pretoria is the Tswaing meteorite crater, suspected to have been formed by a 50m meteorite slamming into the earth approximately 220 000 years ago.

Meteorites may travel at speeds from 11 to 72 Km. a second. This one in about 30 seconds produced a crater 1.13 Km. across, 100m deep, and raising the crater rim above its present height of 60m. above the surrounding springbok flats.

With the passing of time water has accumulated on the crater floor and as it cannot get out salts have accumulated in the water and underlying mud. People have extracted this salt since the middle Stone Age and up to the mid 1950's commercially. The ruins of the Soda and Salt plant can still be seen today.

On the site attached to the parking and braai area is a small lecture hall where we will hopefully organize a lecture at 10:00am on the crater history. There is a variety of vegetation growing around the crater and on the slopes due to the varying depths of soil, water retention and soil variations. This and the nearby Soutpanspruit wetland support a rich variety of bird life and some small animals.

There is an almost circular footpath around and through the crater of  $\sim$  7.2Km length, some sections are steep and stony and will take about  $\sim$  3hr. (Some people actually run it?)

Points 1 to 10 are comparatively easy, and the walk to the lake on a road from point 7 to 15 quite easy, but take it slowly coming back, as it is all uphill.

If you want to do the entire walk, suitable foot-ware, a hat, water and a warm jacket are recommended, as it can be cold, hot climbing, and there are no refreshment stops. The temperature can also be 6 deg warmer than Pretoria.

Visitors are given a comprehensive map of the crater when they pay their admission fee of R20.00 for adults and R10.00 for children and a special price for pensioners of R15.00

Over 450 various plant and 250 bird species have been identified in the area, there is also interesting hiking. This is one of 4 impact crater museums in the world and the only one in the southern hemisphere and is easily accessed. A very interesting book on the crater is available at the reception for R100.00, a good buy if you are interested in this type of incident.

If the distance or the thought of 2 Km. (last stretch, very little dust) on a gravel road is a negative join us in your other car and bring some friends or other family members, for a Triumph bring and braai picnic, under the trees in a paradise for nature lovers, hikers and bird watchers or for those who like to relax in the open.

We should meet at the Shell 1 Stop on the N1 North to Pretoria to depart at 08:30am Sunday 22 July.

The one-way distance from the Shell 1 Stop to the Crater is ~ 78Km.

We will travel 34Km on the N1 North towards Polokwani (Pietersburg) past Atterbury turn off. (Pretoria TSSCSA) and turn left into Zambezi Drive; pay a toll of R7.50 (not reclaimable) 8Km later, at the T-junction turn Right into the R101 (Lavender Rd.).

1,7Km later at a robot turn Left into the R566, R513. Almost immediately,

800m later just over the railway bridge turn Right into the M35 follow this road for  $\sim$  29Km. to the entrance of the Tswaing Crater Reception.

This last section goes through the Soshanguve settlement area, and there are a number of speed humps and 4 way stop streets. Keep to the demarcated speed limits, which vary, the speed humps should not be a problem as they are long and not too high.

A picnic type of meal would be preferable as it takes less time to prepare, and quite a bit of time may be required for a Crater lecture, sight seeing and socializing.


There are trees with benches to sit under. A fire will be made for those wanting to Braai.

#### **Directions FROM Pretoria to Dawie Gouws**

Take the left offramp R23 Benoni.

2<sup>nd</sup> robot left at M32 Petit and keep going straight.

At stop street after 3<sup>rd</sup> robot bear left towards Petit

Stay on this road until after Nature Road on your left to the next left which is Ystervark Road but there is NO ROAD SIGN

Turn left into Ystervark Road.

At stop sign bear right into Nature Road go down to the last road at T junction this is Ash road. Turn left now sand road for approx 50m and enter Plot 115 on the right Please note proceed very slowly DO NOT CREATE DUST AS FARMER ON YOUR RIGHT WILL GREET YOU WITH A SHOTGUN and you're there. For those yuppies out there Dawie's co-ordinates are as follows: S26 04 696 E028 20 863 – these directions can be used by the JHB members as well.

From JHB to OR Tambo freeway take PTA North freeway stay on this freeway until you reach the Benoni offramp, turn right and then follow above directions. If all else fails contact Harry on cell no. 0729977851. Please note you have a choice of braaing or bring your own picnic lunch (braai fires will be supplied) and please bring your own and chairs and tables.

I need to give you an update on matters regarding the Spitfire 50th anniversary. The idea all along was to use AFB Swartkop where the SAAF Museum is situated because their facilities and setting for a 'Spitfire' event are ideal. The date we had in mind that was also given to you was 23 September.

I went to see the OC of the SAAF Museum yesterday about our plan and they were very accommodating but the date of 23 September does not suit them because they have other flying activities booked from 15 to 23 September. Also, we have to have our event on a Saturday because their facilities such as the museum exhibitions, restaurant and bar are closed on a Sunday. So I have booked <u>Saturday 8<sup>th</sup>.</u>

We will be able to have a Triumph display on the apron in front of the control tower so that we can take photos from the top. They will also be prepared to pull some museum aircraft, such as the P51 Mustang, out of their hangers for us for individual photo sessions. If Friends of the Museum do the braai for us we will have the use of Hanger 5 that is fitted out with tables and chairs and is situated close by to our car display. In the meantime we are negotiating to have a flying 80% scale model of a Spitfire flown from Rand Airport for our benefit on the day.

The event is not limited to Spitfires only. In fact, we would like every Pretoria and Jo'burg Triumph owner to be able to participate in this historic event. After all, it is six years ago (at the Voortrekker Monument) since we last enjoyed a really big Triumph festival.

We must try, between Jo'burg and Pretoria, to get at least 20 Spitfires together on the day to be parked in the shape '50', but we will need many more other Triumphs to form a circle around the '50' for a commemorative photo taken from the top of the control tower or even from a helicopter that could be arranged.


